The home environment helps with the diagnosis, management, and treatment of my patients too. I also work around your busy schedule, so that you don't have to take the day off of work or use your weekend to visit the vet. I am available 24/7 for emergencies.

My youngest patient is 3 months old and my oldest is 18. The care I provide ranges from checkups and cleaning teeth to the hard cases that others have either washed their hands of or mismanaged.

I practice traditional, alternative, and regenerative veterinary approaches for the care and maintenance of your animals. Specializing in animal physical therapy, my therapeutic maintenance and treatment options include acupuncture, laser, chiropractic/massage therapy, and prolotherapy. I see a lot of back and knee injury patients and often use prolotherapy, which in many cases is a much better choice than surgery, both physically and economically. Prolotherapy involves rebuilding tendons and ligaments over a period of months. Each case is unique and I use any combination of massage, acupuncture, laser, and more. I am a Member of the AVMA, AHVA, AARV. I am certified in acupuncture and laser therapy, as well as USDA certified for national and international health certificates.

Carnegie Hill Canines

Carnegie Hill canines and other dogs residing in the 10128 zip code have something in common with those at zip 10314 and neighboring 10312 in Staten Island—the most dogs in New York City!

Zip 10314 is in first place, with 1,657 registered; 10312 is in 2nd place, with 1,609; and 10128 is in third place, with 1,537, according to information culled from the NYC Dept. of Health and Mental Hygiene database for dog license registration.

The most common breed for both Staten Island and Carnegie Hill is the mixed breed, with 10128 coming in at 456, and 10314 at 426. (continued inside)

Even though this spring hasn't brought much an warm weather, the increasing daylight and she strength of the sun has triggered changes in your dog. Whether fido is Don'ts

'fixed' or not, increased sunlight ignites chemicals in his or her brain, promoting

FOOd Your dog is extra hungry, but **do not increase food** unless you also increase exercise.

Exercise Your dog needs to slowly get back into shape from the inactivity of winter. Use moderation as you increase exercise. Only let your dog *drink or eat a very small amount before, during, and right after exercise.* If their stomach is too heavy they may get severe stomach cramps or worse. Dogs that are large, or any size with a narrow deep-chested body, are particularly prone to canine acute gastric dilatation-volvulus (GDV). This condition may occur when the stomach is too heavy during exercise and it flips over and expands, trapping air and gases in the

stomach. This could lead to a medical and surgical emergency. As a preventive, when I get large female dogs spayed, I have the surgeon also do a gastropexy, to tack the stomach lining to the abdominal wall.

Sniffing Colder weather tempers the diseases your dog can get from sniffing fellow canine markings on the ground. Even though a dog's nose filters dirt and disease, it is anything but foolproof in preventing illness, especially after the weather warms and stays above freezing. Not only are the flowers and trees growing and thriving in the

warmth, so are bacteria, viruses, and parasites. Dogs with short noses are even more

an adventurous spirit along with induced shedding. Appetite and energy also increase,

an experience you may share. Here are some basic do's and don'ts to help you and your dog celebrate the season in a wise and healthy manner.

susceptible to sniffing in disease. So, in warmer weather, you should be sure to watch your dog more carefully.

Sneezing Yes, dogs get allergies to pollen too. This can lead to sneezing, coughing, dripping eyes, and evolve to a weakened immune system. If allergies get too bad for your dog, there are certain remedies I can advise.

Fleas & Ticks The time is now to start using a flea and tick deterrent, even if you don't go to the common locations where fleas and ticks thrive—the country, beaches, woods, or parks. Fleas are tenacious and quick. Many a dog picks them up just visiting the vet or neighbor's pet.




NO LONG-DISTANCE RUNS! Careful—your dog's paw pads or internal organs can get injured if you go too far.

Weekend Warriors

CAR Most people are surprised to hear that you should not let your dog jump out when the car is at rest—no matter the size of your dog. When landing on the ground, their front legs take all the impact, which can seriously hurt their elbows. Get a ramp or a harness or carry your dog. BIKE Do not put your dog in the basket or let your dog run beside you on a leash. Your dog's motive is to keep up with you—you cannot gauge his or her real experience. They can injure their paw pads and joints, and tax their organs and entire body.

JOGGING The <u>most</u> a dog should run is a mile. Take breaks, keep it slow, mind your dog's experience and needs.



Carnegie Hill Canines (continued from first page) Shi Tzu is the top pure breed for both zips. Labrador Retrievers and Yorkshire Terriers come in 2nd and 3rd in 10128, with the reverse in 10314. Lucy, Max, and Molly are the top 3 names for 10128. Bella, Rocky, and Max top 10314. Bella ranks 17th and Rocky 7th in 10128. Lucy is 16th and Molly is 6th in 10314. Complaints phoned in to 311 last year totaled 230 for 10128 and 503 for 10312. With "canine noise"

The Shih Tzu originated in China, officially recognized by the American Kennel Club in 1969. The popular breed is susceptible to breathing problems and heat stroke, due to the short face structure. So when temperature and humidity rise, take care not to overexert. They are also vulnerable to serious back, hip, and neck issues, so be cautious about jumping and other exercise.



The Animal Fan Movie Guide

If you're into family movies, dramas, comedies, or suspense, and you prefer stars with feathers, fur, or scales, there is a movie coming soon to you. Here are highlights of films in production or development that are expected to be released this year or next.

LONE RANGER: THE LEGEND RETURNS • Native American spirit warrior Tonto (Johnny Depp) recounts the tales that transformed John Reid (Armie Hammer), a man of the law, into a legend of justice, Lone Ranger. Hi Ho Silver! July 2013.

CLOUDY WITH A CHANCE OF MEATBALLS 2: REVENGE OF THE LEFTOVERS • Cloudy 2 picks will be based on an original idea and not the follow-up book, *Pickles to Pittsburgh*. With the fate of humanity in his hands, Flint and his friends must embark on a dangerously delicious mission, battling hungry tacodiles, shrimpanzees, apple pie-thons, double-bacon cheespiders, and other food creatures to save the world... again. I think these are animals? 3D Sept. 2013

TURKEYS • This animated family comedy is directed by Ash Brannon of *Horton Hears a Who*. Woody Harrelson, Owen Wilson, Dan Fogler, and Amy Poehler casted. Birds from opposite sides of the tracks, joining forces to get their species off people's plates, hijack a top-secret time machine to go to the first Thanksgiving in 1621. Coming Nov. 2013

WALKING WITH DINOSAURS • Based on the BBC documentary series that explores the world of dinosaurs, using both CGI and real-world locations, the film is said to be "mainstream entertainment" while accurately drawing on the latest paleontology discoveries. Shooting in Australia, 3D Dec. 2013

ANIMAL RESCUE • This crime drama, mystery, stars Tom Hardy and Noomi Rapace. A bartender (Hardy) finds a wounded puppy in the garbage, leading to a trip through the criminal underbelly of Boston in this adaptation of Dennis Lehane's short story. Seems intense. 2014

ANIMAL FARM • This classic will be re-made by Andy Serkis with performance-capture techniques. 2014

MR. PEABODY AND SHERMAN • A family adventure film based on Jay Ward's classic cartoon. Emmy Award winner Ty Burrell voices Mr. Peabody, the world's smartest person who happens to be a dog. When his "pet" boy Sherman (Max Charles) uses their time-traveling machine without permission, events in history spiral out of control. I loved the original cartoon on T.V. Animated 3D 2014

THE MUPPETS AGAIN ... Filming in London and Hollywood. Tina Fey stars as Nadya, a feisty prison guard, and Ty Burrell as Interpol agent Jean Pierre Napoleon. The Muppets gang is on tour, selling out grand theaters across Europe. But mayhem follows them, as they find themselves unwittingly entangled in an international crime caper. Again is right... 2014

NOAH • This classic drama adventure story is shooting in Iceland this August. The cast includes Emma Watson and

Russell Crow. You know the plot: Noah builds the ark and saves his family and representatives of all animals from the massive flood waters that cover the Earth. 2014

BEARS • This Walt Disney movie is currently in production shooting in Alaska's Katmai National Park. Starring brown bears who call Alaska's stunning coastal mountains and shores their home, revealing through tender moments and entertaining imagery how these animals are far from grizzly creatures. The director is Matt Reeves, and Total Recall screenwriter Mark Bomback has been tapped to work on the script. The cast will include Andy Serkis and Gary Oldman. 2014

NINJA TURTLES • This 3D reboot story centers on the turtle crime fighters, including Leonardo, Michelangelo, Donatello, and Raphael, and their master, Splinter. A live-action feature, it was previously with Mirage Studios, Lightbox, and TMNT before Nickelodeon bought the franchise rights. 2014

THE GOOD DINOSAUR • What if the cataclysmic asteroid that forever changed life on Earth actually missed the planet completely and giant dinosaurs never became extinct? Animated family movie. 2014

JURASSIC PARK IV • Will rely on animatronic dinosaurs, despite advancements in technology over the last decade. Rumor is some old characters may return! Yes, 3D. 2014
